A Message from Fr. Angelito

Dear Friends in Christ,

Today is Catechetical Sunday, an opportune time for us to realize and reflect on the fact that each person plays a vital role, by virtue of Baptism, in handing on our faith and being a witness to the Gospel. We invite our catechists and volunteers to the 11:30 AM Mass for a special blessing, and there's a small hospitality for them after Mass. We will commission the catechists as they serve our parish as teachers and leaders of the faith. A big word of thanks as they generously share their talents, efforts, and time spreading the Good News to our young people.

This year's Catechetical Sunday theme is: "This is my Body given for you." The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. The term "Eucharist" comes from the Greek word eucharistia, meaning thanksgiving. When we celebrate the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and the instrumentality of the priest. The whole Christ is truly present --- body, blood, soul, and divinity - under the appearances of bread and wine, the glorified Christ who rose from the dead, this is what the Eucharist is all about; the Church speaks of this - the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist.

TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Todays first reading, in the Book of Amos, as well as the Gospel, address issues of wealth and approach it in two different ways. Amos is blunt and aggressive, while the Gospel is indirect and thought-provoking. In both instances, we are startled, either by the direct speech that hits us between the eyes or by the baffling praise for the dishonest and ingenious steward and by the mystifying one-liners at the end of the Gospel, which entails privacy and space to think and pray. Amos spoke frankly and critically and confronted his contemporaries. He called the people back to the wholeness of life and solidarity as one people under God. He reminded them of the futility of their fancy liturgies and solemn assemblies as long as they kept exploiting the poor.

Jesus tells an unusual parable that appears to support dishonesty. But the message is clear. The steward is praised not for his dishonesty but for his ability to cope with an emergency situation with great speed to ensure his own future. If a dishonest man can use his employer's money to ensure that there will be people to welcome him when he is sacked, how much more should honest people use their money so that they will be welcomed into the kingdom of God!

Jesus reminds us that the use of money should always be related to social justice and personal responsibility. Our worship of God has influenced the way we behave. Our dealings with our fellowmen ensure our fellowship in God's kingdom. He uses the parable of the unjust steward to remind us of the need to be more zealous for heavenly things. It is the steward's resourcefulness and ingenuity that Jesus commends, not his dishonest methods, for ensuring his future. Worldly people go to far greater trouble to secure wealth than devout spiritual men do to obtain spiritual wealth.

Allow me to share Christ's teaching for us in today's Gospel on three levels:

- 1. Crisis: In a crisis, act resolutely and resourcefully. The manager was faced with an crisis. But he acted promptly and prudently. An encounter with Christ, either by hearing his Word or by some events in life, is a moment of crisis. The temptation is to postpone any action. But Christ counsels us to act resolutely and resourcefully.
- 2. Trustworthiness: When we require a friend or someone to do business with, the first quality we look for is trustworthiness. This is also the purpose of demanding a certificate of good moral character. How happy we are when we find a faithful friend or a loyal colleague, and how it saddens us when our trust is betrayed!
- 3. Wholeness: Divided loyalty leads to divisiveness, the disintegration of one's personality, and mammon as our god. Anything or anyone that prevents us from loving and serving God wholeheartedly can become our idol. And Christ emphatically says: "You cannot serve God and mammon." How do we measure up to Christ's requirement?



SAINT OF THE WEEK


Best known as Padre Pio, St. Pius was born Francesco Forgione in 1887 in Pietrelcina, Italy. As a young boy he suffered many illnesses including typhoid. He joined Capuchin Franciscans at 15 and took the name of Pius or "Pio" in honor of Pope Pius I. He was ordained in 1910, and at this time he received the marks of stigmata, the wounds of Christ, but they eventually healed. Frequent illnesses continued to plague him as a young man.

Padre Pio served in the Italian Medical Corps during World War I, but he was discharged early because of illness, which was likely tuberculosis. He was assigned to the friary in San Giovanni Rotondo. In 1918, while continuing to serve at the friary, the stigmata appeared again, and this time remained until his death.

Many faithful came to see him at the friary, his days were long, beginning with Mass at 5 a.m. then hearing confessions all day with breaks to bless the sick. A simple man, content to do God's will on earth and with the ardent desire to serve the sick and poor in whom he saw Christ, he urged a hospital, Casa Sollievo della Sofferenza (House for the Relief of Suffering), to be built in San Giovanni Rotondo. It opened in 1956.

Padre Pio died at the age of eighty-one in 1968 and in 2002 Pope John Paul II proclaimed him "St. Pio of Pietrelcina."



SPONSORS FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

For sponsor requests from St. Catherine', you must be registered at

St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request, showing participation in the life & support of the Church.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago but now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of this parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

REASONS WHY TO REGISTER IN THE PARISH

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong.

Registration is a commitment to community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of the parish. Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining a Sponsor/Godparent Certificate and Letter of Eligibility, and donation statements for your income tax returns. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission.

Registering in the parish is simple. It just requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself by contacting the Parish Office. Young adults 18 and over who are still living at home with their parents, or attend college, are recommended to register in their own name. Thank You.
