A Message from Fr. Angelito

Dear Friends in Christ,

One of the most popular and thriving seasons is Summer, as daylight is longer than others. It is an excellent opportunity for family gatherings and visits, students are on vacation from school, and of course, we can do



plenty of work, particularly inside and outside the house. It is hard to believe that we September is here and another season is fast approaching. The nation celebrates the day of rest on September 5, Labor Day. The unofficial conclusion of the Summer Season is over, and soon enough, students are returning to school, We wish tall the youth and college students lots of luck for the coming school another of vear as they enter vear education and learning. Always remember that education is one of the primary means of success in life as we keep in mind our faith and live out that belief and trust in God.

TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Great multitudes accompanied Jesus." For one bent on cheap popularity, that was a lot of grist to the mill. He would have avidly cashed in on it. For is it not human to aspire to win adulation, popularity, and applause? Jesus did not come to get approval from people. He came to approve them. He did not want people to be swept off their feet. First, he wanted them to be themselves and stand on their own feet. And he would help them to be themselves. Jesus is the light of the world, and he who follows him does not walk in darkness. But a high price is exacted from the prospective disciple. On the one hand, he must give up everyone and everything he holds dear, and on the other hand, he has to take up that which he would be willing to give up, whatever it is!

Jesus is not a cheap leader, nor does he want cheap followers. He makes them think, reflect and decide. To drive this point home, he uses stories. No one can build a tower with a few thousand dollars. Nor does anyone engage in warfare without adequate information about the enemy. "Following Me," Jesus tells us, "is like that. You must know what you are going to do. Otherwise, you will deceive yourselves and look ridiculous in front of others."

"The Gospel of the Lord." We know that Gospel means 'good news.' But is it good news to be told that we must turn our backs on our parents, spouses, children, brothers, and sisters? That we must renounce all our possessions? That is breathtaking. But it is also inspiring. Is it any different, at the bottom, from the demand Jesus makes when he tells us that he must mean more than family and possessions, even our very lives? Following Christ means putting him first--- ahead of money, possessions, success, ahead of those whom we love most, ahead of our very selves; it also means not having trust in our resources alone. If we don't do so, we are like the farmer building his tower without calculating the cost, like the king setting out recklessly on a military campaign against hopeless odds.

We gather around the Lord's holy table to receive spiritual power. This power is not something impersonal but spiritual electricity, as if we are here to get our batteries recharged for another week. The power that is offered to us here is a Person. His name is Jesus Christ.

Lord, may all my decisions be inspired and motivated by you, love and be for you. Amen.



Saint of the Week

Born in Catalonia Spain in 1580, Saint Peter Claver studied at first at the University of Barcelona and then joined the Jesuits. He became friends with fellow brother Saint Alphonsus Rodriguez who encouraged him to be a missionary in the New World. Accordingly, Saint Peter went to Cartagena, a city in present-day Columbia where he was ordained in in 1615.

Cartagena was a center for the slave trade, and the young missionary knew where he could best serve God. He proclaimed himself, "the slave of the Negroes forever." As ships would arrive with their human cargo, Saint Peter and a group of interpreters would rush into the hold with food and medicines. When the slaves were moved to pens to await sale, the saint continued to work among them, communicating God's love with acts of generosity and teaching the Catholic faith. He also led missions in the interior, refusing the hospitality of plantation owners and preferring to stay in the slave quarters. He organized charitable societies and is said to have baptized and catechized more than 300,000 enslaved persons. Saint Peter Claver died on September 8, 1654. He was canonized with his friend Saint Alphonsus Rodriguez in 1888, by Pope Leo XIII. He is the worldwide patron saint of

African Americans and of enslaved peoples.

SPONSORS FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

For sponsor requests from St. Catherine', you must be registered at

St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request, showing participation in the life & support of the Church.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now</u> <u>lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of this</u> <u>parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in</u> <u>whose territory he/she resides</u>. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

REASONS WHY TO REGISTER IN THE PARISH

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong.

Registration is a commitment to community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of the parish. Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining a Sponsor/Godparent Certificate and Letter of Eligibility, and donation statements for your income tax returns. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission.

Registering in the parish is simple. It just requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself by contacting the Parish Office. Young adults 18 and over who are still living at home with their parents, or attend college, are recommended to register in their own name. Thank You.




