

A Message from our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

Today, Palm Sunday, the entire Christian World starts off with the holiest days of the year as Holy Week is ordered to the commemoration of Christ's Passion beginning with his Messianic entrance into Jerusalem. We have blessed our Palms at the Saturday Vigil Mass so please take them home after the Sunday Eucharistic Liturgy today.

Kindly pick up a copy of today's Bulletin to follow and observe all of our Holy Week Services and activities in the Church. A friendly reminder that Good Friday is "paschal fast" and if it's possible we continue until Holy Saturday. As a result, we the people of God will receive the joy of the Lord's resurrection with uplifted and responsive hearts.

PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

In spiritual life, what matters is not what I do but what I allow the Lord to do in and through me. If I can be useful to the Lord as a donkey, I am ready and totally willing to be His donkey. My only concern is to be His best donkey.

Jesus appreciated small things. Among the throng of rich people making a display of their wealth by their large contributions to the temple treasury, Jesus had eyes to see and praise the insignificant offering of a poor widow. He also assured us that even a cup of cold water offered in His name would have its reward.

It is the Lord who is in need of a donkey for His royal procession and solemn entry into Jerusalem! What a rich and revealing irony and paradox! The Lord will dramatically and graphically demonstrate the paradoxical and even revolutionary nature of Lordship on Holy Thursday. After washing the feet of His disciples, Jesus asks them a very pointed question: "Do you understand what I have just done to you? You call Me Teacher and Lord, and it is right. You do so, because that's what I am. I, your Lord and Teacher, have just washed your feet" (Jn 13:13-14).

Tis is an egoless service. Our ego is the number one obstacle preventing us from doing humble service. Our ego wants to be the lion, the king of the forest, and not a dumb donkey. Jesus was an egoless person. So, He could comfortably sit on a donkey and enter Jerusalem triumphantly.

A true disciple of Jesus has no problem being a donkey or being a lion. He/she makes himself/ herself available to the Master, disposing his/her self at the feet of the Master. Not only to be His donkey, but even the cloaks and branches strewn on His path, so that even a donkey can trample on them.

Lord, teach me the sublime beauty of humility and the wisdom of littleness. Amen.

Lenten Regulations

February 1, 2023

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

During the days and weeks of penance that lie ahead --- from *Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2023, until Holy Thursday morning, April 6, 2023 ---* the Catholic Church throughout the world commemorates the penitential season of Lent ending with the Sacred Triduum of Holy Week. The model Jesus gave us for "these forty days" was his own experience in the desert and the temptations that followed him there where he encountered Satan face to face. And yet, Jesus, there in the desert --- alone, fasting and in intense prayer --- beat back the devil and triumphed over temptation, as strong and as unrelenting as it was throughout those forty days.

We enter the desert of Lent like Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit, to face our devils, our temptations head on. But we are not alone. The Lord Jesus Christ is with us. And so, too, is the Church, the entire community of faith observing Lent. Here is what the Catholic Church in the United States requires of us as baptized Catholics:

The days of FAST (only one full meal) <u>and</u> ABSTINENCE (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below. ALL OTHER FRIDAYS OF LENT are days of ABSTINENCE.

The pastor of a parish has the faculty to give a dispensation to <u>individual</u> parishioners in his parish and the Diocesan Bishop alone has the authority to dispense groups of Catholics but only for a serious reason.

Those who are automatically dispensed from fast and abstinence regulations outside the age limits noted below include: the physically or mentally ill, especially individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also included in the dispensation are women who are pregnant or nursing. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat): this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the intentional failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered a serious matter.

The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called "Easter duty" --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 25-26, 2023, to Trinity Sunday, June 3-4, 2023.** However, the Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

I want to encourage all Catholics, especially those who are conscious of serious sin, to go to confession and to make use of the sacrifices and traditions that have always been part of our Lenten practices in the Church.

We do, indeed, fast and pray with the Lord Jesus and with our fellow Catholics. May this Lent be a time of penance leading to grace and joy for us all at Easter.

SPONSORSHIP FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

For sponsor requests from St. Catherine's, you must be registered at

St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request, showing participation in the life & support of the Church.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but</u> now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of <u>this parish</u>.

Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.


