

A Message from our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

Once again, our parish family is going to have The other disciples, without such a gripping the Missionary Appeal Weekend, August 26-27, personal experience of Jesus' saving power, 2023. Rev. Joseph Akilo, from the Roman reply to Jesus' question with answers drawn Catholic Diocese of Kumbo, will be with us this from the experience of their ancestors, not their weekend. TWENTY FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In todays Gospel the disciples of Jesus are faced with a difficult question, perhaps a strange one: "Who do you say that I am?"

A deeper and more reflective reading of today's Gospel shows the real reason for Jesus" question. He wants to teach us another dimension in our relationship with God. To the question, "Who do you say that I am?" it is Simon, soon to be called Peter, who answers that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God.

Jesus comments: "Flesh and blood has not revealed it to you, but My Heavenly Father" (MT 16:13-17). Recall what Jesus said earlier, "All things have been handed over to Me by My Father. No one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal Him" (11:27). No calculus, no philosophical arguments, no mental gymnastics can truly answer this question. Who is Jesus? Only the O God of my life, may I thirst for you as a Father's grace will.

Peter acknowledges who Jesus is (Son of God), because, in spite of his doubt, Peter is saved May God bless you, from the raging seas. Jesus reveals who He is Father Angelito through Peter's experience of fright, sinking and being saved.

Peter has a new and personal experience of God's saving power in Jesus and so he answers from a faith standpoint beyond where the other disciples are, a knowledge that has only come because the heavenly Father has revealed it to him. Peter acknowledges Jesus as the awaited Messiah.

Revelation does not mean that we sit around in silence, waiting for God to speak to us. It means that we open our eyes to see, our ears to hear and our hearts to experience Jesus' presence and power in the daily happening around us. It is only our faith that enables us to walk on the stormy sea of life, hear Jesus' call and venture out into the raging waters.

Jesus does not want an answer that we gained as a result of research or even based on the experience of others. He wants our personal answer that defines our relationships with Him. He is not looking for a scholarly theory, theological opinion but wants a surrendering and abiding experience of Him that will help us to encounter him in our lives. What answer we give to Jesus depends on this. Amen.



SPONSORSHIP FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

For sponsor requests from St. Catherine's, you must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request, showing participation in the life & support of the Church.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago **but now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of** <u>this parish.</u>

Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

First-time parents are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class prior to scheduling the Baptism.

Godparents are required to provide Sponsor Certificates before a Baptismal date is given.




