

## A Message from our Pastor

My Friends in Christ,

This weekend is launching the Diocesan Annual Catholic Appeal in our parish. Our parish goal assigned to us is Forty Thousand Dollars, the same as last year. To receive a rebate, we should be able to collect payments that equal or exceed our goal. We are pleased that we exceeded the goal last year and received a rebate of \$6,750. We use this rebate for the parish's upkeep and maintenance, including the chapel and the parish's complex grounds. We encourage you to support and make your donations to the appeal as your means allow and help the diocese's ministries and our parish. Thanks so much for your kind-hearted and generous gifts as we move forward and help each other promote the appeal.

#### SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

This is what God reminds us of and commands us in today's readings. "Be holy, for I, the Lord your God, am holy" (1st reading). "Surely you know that you are God's temple and God's Spirit lives in you!... God's temple is holy, and you yourselves are His temple!" (2nd reading). "You must therefore be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Gospel).

Many feel, "This holiness talk is for priests and religious. I am an average Christian struggling to make ends meet." We feel at home with the lifestyles of the rich and famous. Holiness is a subject that numbs our minds and blurs our vision. It leaves us more frustrated than inspired. And we wonder, "How can we become holy?"

Holiness is an inside job. St. Paul writes to the Corinthians: "Are you not aware that you are the temple of God?" Holiness is not something like a hat that we put on our heads. It is living the life of the One who fashioned us. We must be cautious about godmen and godwomen who offer salvation like instant coffee without taking any trouble. God is the standard of Christian conduct and the apex of Christian holiness. In pursuing moral perfection, a Christian should not ask: "How much further can I go without committing mortal sin?" Instead, his concern must be: "How much do I resemble my heavenly Father?"

FEBRUARY 22 is Ash Wednesday, which marks the liturgical season of penance in preparation for Easter. During the forty days that begin with ASH Wednesday and conclude on Holy Thursday, we, as the faithful, are encouraged to engage in penitential acts of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving to heighten our spiritual life and draw us closer to God. Though often associated with the avoidance of food and drink, fasting can be the voluntary avoidance of anything valued and enjoyed. The two obligatory food fast days during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On those days, persons between 18 and 60 should have only one full meal, though smaller amounts of food may be taken in the morning and at noon. Everyone 14 years and older is to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays during Lent. Please check the website and the parish bulletin for our schedule of Masses and Services for Ash Wednesday. Thank you so much.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

During the days and weeks of penance that lie ahead --- from **Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2023, until Holy Thursday morning, April 6, 2023 ---** the Catholic Church throughout the world commemorates the penitential season of Lent ending with the Sacred Triduum of Holy Week. The model Jesus gave us for "these forty days" was his own experience in the desert and the temptations that followed him there where he encountered Satan face to face. And yet, Jesus, there in the desert --- alone, fasting and in intense prayer --- beat back the devil and triumphed over temptation, as strong and as unrelenting as it was throughout those forty days.

We enter the desert of Lent like Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit, to face our devils, our temptations head on. But we are not alone. The Lord Jesus Christ is with us. And so, too, is the Church, the entire community of faith observing Lent. Here is what the Catholic Church in the United States requires of us as baptized Catholics:

The days of FAST (only one full meal) <u>and</u> ABSTINENCE (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below. ALL OTHER FRIDAYS OF LENT are days of ABSTINENCE.

The pastor of a parish has the faculty to give a dispensation to <u>individual</u> parishioners in his parish and the Diocesan Bishop alone has the authority to dispense groups of Catholics but only for a serious reason.

Those who are automatically dispensed from fast and abstinence regulations outside the age limits noted below include: the physically or mentally ill, especially individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also included in the dispensation are women who are pregnant or nursing. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat): this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the intentional failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered a serious matter.

The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called "Easter duty" --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 25-26, 2023, to Trinity Sunday, June 3-4, 2023.** However, the Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

I want to encourage all Catholics, especially those who are conscious of serious sin, to go to confession and to make use of the sacrifices and traditions that have always been part of our Lenten practices in the Church.

We do, indeed, fast and pray with the Lord Jesus and with our fellow Catholics. May this Lent be a time of penance leading to grace and joy for us all at Easter.

### SPONSORSHIP FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

## Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

#### For sponsor requests from St. Catherine's, you must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request, showing participation in the life & support of the Church.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but</u> <u>now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of</u> <u>this parish.</u>

Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.






