



A Message from our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

As we know Lent is the time of the year when we reflect most deeply on where we have been and where we are heading. This self-reflection is not always easy, as it compels us to dig down to those aspects of our lives that are most difficult to consider.

God created Adam and Eve, gave them powers superior to those of all other creatures, and expected from them in return obedience and reverence. But the first man and woman, because of their pride in the gifts given them, refused that obedience, with disastrous results for themselves and their descendants. We have every reason to regret that our first parents acted so foolishly and so ungratefully. But what about us right now? Daily we see many manifestations of God's goodness to us. Yet often do we disobey God and act even more foolishly and ungratefully than our first parents! Is it not a great cause for shame and regret for each one of us?

In the second reading, Paul speaks of some of the immediate effect of salvation Christ won for us. He has conquered sin and death and won eternal life for all who follow Him. All those who are prepared to die with Him are given the assurance that they will rise with Him to an everlasting life of glory. They become children of God, entitled to call God 'Father, Abba.'

The temptations to which our Lord allowed himself to be submitted are for us a source of encouragement and consolation. If our Lord and Master underwent temptations, we cannot and must not expect to live a life without experiencing similar tests and trials. Our basic temptation in life are the same, namely, bodily comfort and pleasure, the empty esteem of our fellow human beings, wealth and power.

There are millions of men and women on earth today ---- many of them, unfortunately, are only nominal Christians ---- who have given in to these temptations and are wasting their lives chasing after these unattainable shadows. But even should they manage to catch up with some of them, they soon find out that they are empty bubbles. They will have to leave them very soon.

Somebody said: "Temptation can bring a service to us. It may be a burden, but it may bring us humility and teach us good lessons. All of the saints experienced their share of temptations and trials, and they grew as a result."

During this Lent, Lord, draw me to you closer in mind and heart. Amen.





Lenten Regulations

February 1, 2023

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

During the days and weeks of penance that lie ahead --- from *Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2023, until Holy Thursday morning, April 6, 2023 ---* the Catholic Church throughout the world commemorates the penitential season of Lent ending with the Sacred Triduum of Holy Week. The model Jesus gave us for "these forty days" was his own experience in the desert and the temptations that followed him there where he encountered Satan face to face. And yet, Jesus, there in the desert --- alone, fasting and in intense prayer --- beat back the devil and triumphed over temptation, as strong and as unrelenting as it was throughout those forty days.

We enter the desert of Lent like Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit, to face our devils, our temptations head on. But we are not alone. The Lord Jesus Christ is with us. And so, too, is the Church, the entire community of faith observing Lent. Here is what the Catholic Church in the United States requires of us as baptized Catholics:

The days of FAST (only one full meal) <u>and</u> ABSTINENCE (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below. ALL OTHER FRIDAYS OF LENT are days of ABSTINENCE.

The pastor of a parish has the faculty to give a dispensation to <u>individual</u> parishioners in his parish and the Diocesan Bishop alone has the authority to dispense groups of Catholics but only for a serious reason.

Those who are automatically dispensed from fast and abstinence regulations outside the age limits noted below include: the physically or mentally ill, especially individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also included in the dispensation are women who are pregnant or nursing. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat): this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the intentional failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered a serious matter.

The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called "Easter duty" --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 25-26, 2023, to Trinity Sunday, June 3-4, 2023.** However, the Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

I want to encourage all Catholics, especially those who are conscious of serious sin, to go to confession and to make use of the sacrifices and traditions that have always been part of our Lenten practices in the Church.

We do, indeed, fast and pray with the Lord Jesus and with our fellow Catholics. May this Lent be a time of penance leading to grace and joy for us all at Easter.

SPONSORSHIP FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

For sponsor requests from St. Catherine's, you must be registered at

St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request, showing participation in the life & support of the Church.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but</u> now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of <u>this parish</u>.

Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.




