



A Message from our Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

The three Wise Men from the East had not only observed the signs of the time but also drawn conclusions from them. God knew the greatest desire of their heart. Whether they were kings or not, we are not so confident. But what do we notice about them? They did not remain obsessed with the affairs of their kingdom or set their hearts on how to play power politics. They had an ambition, a desire more significant than all these things --- to see the face of the Messiah.



God knew the deepest longing of their hearts and gave them a sign: the Star. They readily responded to God's call and set out without fear, though the way was unknown and dangerous. To get a glimpse of the newborn King and offer him gifts was their aim, and no hazard, however great, could stop them. Finally, they arrived at their destination but found the 'newborn king' in a tiny, insignificant place, in conditions unthinkable for a king. Yet their faith reassured them; they fully believed the Child was the King and Savior of humanity and offered him their gifts.

Have you seen his Star? Have you heard his call to search for him? He sends His Star today to you in different ways and through other persons and situations to find him and adore him. A wise person and only such one who will recognize the Star of the Lord. He is attuned to the spirit who speaks to him. He will know his vocation and calling and have the courage and generosity to follow it.

The question is: Are you ready to listen to, to recognize the One who calls you, and do you want to meet him? Are you prepared to take the risk, accept challenges in following him and offer your life as a gift to him through faith, hope, love, and service?

Nothing could stop the Magi until they had met the Lord and could offer him their gifts. What about you? Are you afraid? Can anything in the world, be it fame or glory or pleasures or wealth or fear, stop you from meeting the Lord?

Created in the image of God, man carries within him God's image. Man, or at least his soul, is in search of God. The three wise men could represent our soul-seeking God. The wise men sought, found, and adored God. When the soul meets God, it spontaneously falls prostrate in adoration: there is something childlike in it.

An intellectually puffed-up adult won't do it. It was the wise men that discovered the Child in the crib, and the Child in the crib smiled at the child in the wise men --- the source and summit of religion. The wise men forgot that they were wise; they became light-hearted and playful. It was a child's world all over, a kingdom of God where only children and the child-like have entry. It was God-man in a child and man with the God-child!

Baby Jesus in the crib, help me to be child-like and kneel before you in adoration with the simplicity of heart and humility of mind. Amen.



WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question:

How are the feasts of the baptism of Jesus and the account of the wedding feast of Cana related to the Epiphany celebration?

Answer:

The Epiphany season focuses on revealing Jesus to the world. Following the Christmas celebration, the liturgical year lays out a series of manifestation points in which Jesus is made publicly known. From its very beginning, the Christian community highlighted three events in the life of Jesus. These are the Epiphany, the Baptism of the Lord and the wedding feast at Cana.

The Epiphany discloses Jesus to the world of the Gentiles, represented by the magi from the East. The accounts of Jesus' baptism reveal his identity and mission, along with exposing him to those to whom he was sent to minister. The miracle of turning water to wine at the wedding feast of Cana, unique to John's Gospel, is the first public sign that Jesus performs, thus manifesting his public identity and his powers.

Today in the Roman Church, these are usually celebrated on three successive Sundays: Epiphany, the Baptism of the Lord which is usually the next Sunday, and the wedding feast of Cana, which is proclaimed on the 2nd Sunday of Ordinary Time in lectionary year C.

These feasts connect around the concept of epiphany, public manifestation of Jesus to the world. They help us get to know more intimately who Jesus is and what he is about. Spend some time delving more deeply into your understanding of who Jesus is. Continue to cultivate these "epiphany" moments in your life.

DID YOU KNOW?

Parish Registration

Question:

Why is it so important that we register in a parish? Isn't it good enough that we go to Mass?

Answer:

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Many people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. At times, young adults who have moved away for years think they are still signed up under their parents. But membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish.

Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social, and ministerial activities of your parish. Your registration affects the parish in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled.

Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining sponsor certificates, and getting donation statements for taxes. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission. Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.

SPONSORSHIP FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

For sponsor requests from St. Catherine's, you must be registered at

St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request, showing participation in the life & support of the Church.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but</u> now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of <u>this parish</u>.

Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

First-time parents are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class prior to scheduling the Baptism.

Godparents are required to provide Sponsor Certificates before a Baptismal date is given.


Dear God, thank you for making the stars move and twinkle in a special way, so that the Magi could find Jesus.
