



A Message from our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

The season of Lent is a call to repentance, conversion and a change of heart. Lent is an opportunity to assess our personal and spiritual lives and check on where we are and where we are going with regards to our relationship with God, with others and with ourselves. The parish is offering the sacrament of Reconciliation and Penance to the Religious Classes tomorrow, Monday at 4:30 and 6:00 PM, respectively as well as on Tuesday at 4:30 PM. Please be mindful that this opportunity for the Sacrament of Confessions is open to the community. We have invited a few priests in the area to help us hear confessions and give absolutions. Let us make our Lenten Journey meaningful and joyful as we prepare for the Great Paschal Feast of the Resurrection of Jesus.

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

God speaks to us: "You will never succeed in life if you try to hide your sins. Acknowledge them and give them up; then God will show mercy to you" (Prov. 28:13).

Jesus meets a woman by the well. And this encounter is a turning point in her life. Surely it is not a superficial encounter. It is an in-depth meeting of two persons.

What is this well? Could it be a symbol of inner depth, the deepest level of our consciousness? The woman by the well has to get into the well. But she keeps it well covered and hidden from herself and from the rest of the world. Jesus has to lead her into her depths. It is interesting to note how gently and delicately Jesus does this.

He starts from a weaker stance, with a request for a drink of water. But the woman does not *respond* to Jesus. She *reacts*. Jesus patiently adjusts to her reaction. He doesn't allow her racial prejudice (Jews vs. Samaritans) and her ancestral pride ("Are you greater than our father Jacob?") to prevent Him from leading her to the depths of her consciousness.

Jesus does not refute her claims for any type of superiority. But He, with feather-touch delicacy, disposes of them by transcending them and leads her to deeper truth. He deftly matches all her claims. And she doesn't feel it. With exquisite refinement, Jesus lays bare her private life (her six men) and gently unmasks her. She loses all her claims and the last alibi she loses is her theology; more precisely, her theology of worship ("Our fathers worshipped on this mountain"). Fully unmasked and thoroughly shorn of all her pretensions, she has reached the depth of her well, the depth of her being, Real encounters take place at this level. This is the genuine meeting of two authentic persons. At this depth there are only two possibilities: reception or rejection.

It is to the credit of Jesus that after having 'announced the good news to her', after having brought her face to face with her own self, He leaves her free to decide. And it is to the credit of the woman that despite her initial dodging of the issue, she initially accepts herself as she is (a sinner in need of salvation) and accepts Jesus for what He is (the Savior come to call sinners) and becomes His missionary. After this transforming encounter, she does not keep her experience a secret. She turns her experience of Jesus into a message for others. Because of her, the whole town comes to meet Jesus, many believe in Jesus because of her story; many more come to believe in Him when they meet Him.

Lord Jesus, accept me with all my sinfulness and make me your missionary.



Lenten Regulations

February 1, 2023

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

During the days and weeks of penance that lie ahead --- from *Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2023, until Holy Thursday morning, April 6, 2023 ---* the Catholic Church throughout the world commemorates the penitential season of Lent ending with the Sacred Triduum of Holy Week. The model Jesus gave us for "these forty days" was his own experience in the desert and the temptations that followed him there where he encountered Satan face to face. And yet, Jesus, there in the desert --- alone, fasting and in intense prayer --- beat back the devil and triumphed over temptation, as strong and as unrelenting as it was throughout those forty days.

We enter the desert of Lent like Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit, to face our devils, our temptations head on. But we are not alone. The Lord Jesus Christ is with us. And so, too, is the Church, the entire community of faith observing Lent. Here is what the Catholic Church in the United States requires of us as baptized Catholics:

The days of FAST (only one full meal) <u>and</u> ABSTINENCE (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below. ALL OTHER FRIDAYS OF LENT are days of ABSTINENCE.

The pastor of a parish has the faculty to give a dispensation to <u>individual</u> parishioners in his parish and the Diocesan Bishop alone has the authority to dispense groups of Catholics but only for a serious reason.

Those who are automatically dispensed from fast and abstinence regulations outside the age limits noted below include: the physically or mentally ill, especially individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also included in the dispensation are women who are pregnant or nursing. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat): this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the intentional failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered a serious matter.

The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called "Easter duty" --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 25-26, 2023, to Trinity Sunday, June 3-4, 2023.** However, the Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

I want to encourage all Catholics, especially those who are conscious of serious sin, to go to confession and to make use of the sacrifices and traditions that have always been part of our Lenten practices in the Church.

We do, indeed, fast and pray with the Lord Jesus and with our fellow Catholics. May this Lent be a time of penance leading to grace and joy for us all at Easter.

SPONSORSHIP FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

For sponsor requests from St. Catherine's, you must be registered at

St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request, showing participation in the life & support of the Church.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but</u> now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of <u>this parish</u>.

Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.


