



A Message from our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

FEAST OF THE ASCENSION OF OUR LORD JESUS

Action postulates power. The disciples of Jesus had to act; they had to continue the work of Christ and to witness to Christ, and that in the midst of during violent opposition. They needed power very urgently and they were given power, the power with which Jesus was equipped, the power of the Spirit of God. Just as God had anointed Jesus with the Holy Spirit and with power (Acts 10:38) so were the disciples of Jesus.

"Stephen, therefore, full of grace and power, did great wonders and signs among the people" (Acts 6:8). And when the disciples act with the power from above, people were amazed and accuse them of acting in the power of spirit (liquor). But the apostles were really drunk, drunk with the Spirit of the risen/ascended Lord.

The Lord Jesus has ascended from where He had descended, the bosom of the Father. Now it is for the Church to continue what the Lord was and has done. The Lord, however, will be present to her through His Spirit until the close of the age. Through the power of the Spirit — there is no other substitute — the Church must incarnate Jesus in every nook and corner of the world. This is the task of the local Church.

The Church needs power to exist and to act. But the power from above is given to those who believe. Do we — you and I believe? How often do we believe in the power that comes from mammon! Hence the power-struggle in the Church. We trust more in the power that flows from mammon. That is ultimately our weakness and powerlessness.

The Ascension is a pointer to when real power comes and where we must look up for it. Jesus wants to establish His kingdom here and now through you and me. It is not an earthly kingdom, as people normally think; it is one in which all human beings are called to share in Jesus' life and glory. Jesus has put into our hands the task. He held dearest to His heart: to lead all people into His kingdom, to lead all to the Father.

Lord may your ascension be a powerful source of hope for all who believe in you. Amen.

SPONSORSHIP FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

For sponsor requests from St. Catherine's, you must be registered at

St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request, showing participation in the life & support of the Church.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but</u> now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of <u>this parish</u>.

Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

Baptism

First-time parents are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class prior to scheduling the Baptism.

Godparents are required to provide Sponsor Certificates before a Baptismal date is given.

Engaged Couples should contact our parish at least one year in advance of the proposed date of marriage and before making other arrangements.




