

The mystery of evil is the history of not only one person, but it is also the history of the Old Israel, of the Church, of each and everyone of us. To be the object of special favors does not guarantee anything. Personal responsibility is constantly called for and there is no absolute substitute for it.

Therefore, today's parable has it, the workers of iniquity will be punished, and their works destroyed. Jesus warns us: "The kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a nation producing the fruits of it."

To sin is senseless stupidity, not only because it sets the creature in opposition to its creator, the pot against the potter who molded it, but because it is an offense of the child against its father. "Woe to you who strive with your Maker, earthen vessels with the potter!...Who to anyone who says to a father, "What are you begetting? Or to a woman, "With what are you in labor?" (Is. 45:9-10) The attitude of sinful people calls into questions the very fatherhood of God.

Being a child of God makes sin more adding sin to sin' (Is 30:1). "For they are a rebellious people, faithless children who refuse to heed the instruction of the Lord." (Is 30:9)

and and supplications arise from the people stricken by misfortune. God shows himself to be a Father towards those who have forgotten him. 

SPONSORSHIP FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

For sponsor requests from St. Catherine's, you must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request, showing participation in the life & support of the Church.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago **but now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of this parish.**

Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

First-time parents are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class prior to scheduling the Baptism.

Godparents are required to provide Sponsor Certificates before a Baptismal date is given.



All Creatures of Our God and King Text - St Francis of Assisi 1182-1226 Translation: Rev. William Draper 1927 Melody: Lasst Uns Erfreuen. 1623 Text Meter 8.8.8.8

Creatures of Our God and King" is a beloved Christian hymn that has left an indelible mark on the history of hymnody. Its profound lyrics and timeless melody have resonated with generations of worshippers.

Historical Significance: Written in the early 13th century, "All Creatures of Our God and King" holds a unique place in the history of Christian hymnody. It is attributed to Saint Francis of Assisi, a prominent figure in Christian history known for his love of creation and devotion to Christ. Saint Francis, in his Canticle of the Sun, penned the original Italian text, "Laudato Si, O mi Signore" (Praise be to you, my Lord). This hymn is a poetic expression of Francis's deep reverence for nature and all of God's creations. The hymn gained widespread recognition when it was translated into English by William H. Draper in the late 19th century. Since then, it has become a staple in Christian hymnals across denominations, bridging the gap between ancient spirituality and modern worship.


Prayer




