

# A Message from our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

#### FEAST OF THE DESCENT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Jesus had shared with His disciples His joys and sorrows. Departing from them, He assured them, "I will not leave you orphans. I will send you the Holy Spirit, the Comforter." The disciples had to be rooted in and filled with the Holy Spirit to love and serve as Jesus loved and served. Thus, Jesus's departure would be felt as little as possible. What truly mattered, *His Spirit*, would remain.

On Pentecost Day, the disciples were emboldened and energized by the Spirit of the Risen Lord. Thus, incorporated effectively in the risen Lord, they continued their living and loving in the Spirit; they preserved and shared the Spirit of Jesus.

By baptism we are born as Confirmation mature makes us Christians. Two commonplace. trite statements. But what are their far-reaching implications? In spite of the charm and fun of childhood, a child should inevitably grow. Otherwise, childhood runs the risk of stagnation. Then. all the beauty childhood is turned into ugliness, and innocence becomes culpability. No doubt childhood is a beautiful time, but prolonged childhood means immaturity.

Jesus's disciples became full-fledged apostles, mature and fearless, only after receiving the Holy Spirit. And Jesus asked them explicitly not to launch out into the missionary adventure He Himself had entrusted to them without receiving the Holy Spirit.

The two areas of Christian life more evidently characterized by childlikeness are Christian worship and Christian morality.



A spirit-filled, inspired worship and moral living is free, spontaneous, and joyful. How much of our prayer, liturgical and otherwise, and how much of our moral living is free, spontaneous, and joyful? Often, our worship is monotonous drudgery; it looks more like a drab drill than a hearty, joyful celebration. And our morality is so slavish, so little Christians. joyful, filial, loving, and loyal that the less we mature

> What we lack most is joy; joy in prayer of and worship; joy in moral living. And the outstanding experience of all those whom the of Holy Spirit has particularly touched is of precisely *joy*.

Someone said: "The whole future of the human race depends on bringing the individual soul more completely and perfectly under the sway of the Holy Spirit."

Come, Holy Spirit, and fill me with your gifts and fruits. Amen.


#### Live The Liturgy Inspiration of the Week

### SPONSORSHIP FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

#### Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

#### For sponsor requests from St. Catherine's, you must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request, showing participation in the life & support of the Church.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago **but now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of this parish.** 

Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

First-time parents are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class prior to scheduling the Baptism.

Godparents are required to provide Sponsor Certificates before a Baptismal date is given.



can serve others in their weakness.




