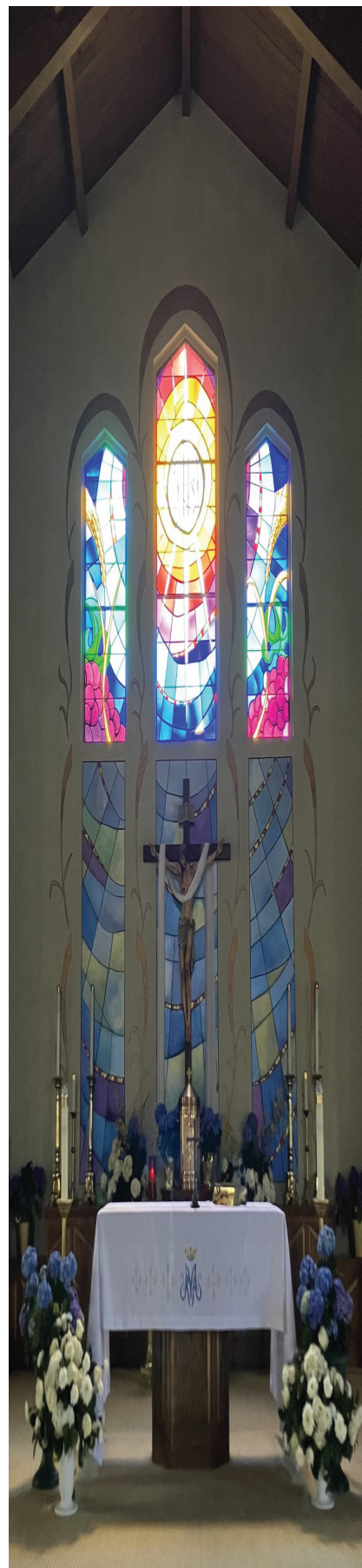

# Our Pastor's Sunday Message

## Pentecost Sunday

Dear Friends in Christ,

This Sunday, we celebrate Pentecost, the powerful moment when the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles, transforming their fear into bold faith and sending them out to proclaim the Good News. Pentecost marks the beginning of the Church's mission in the world—and it is also a reminder that the Holy Spirit continues to guide, empower, and strengthen each of us today.

At our 10:00 AM Mass, we rejoice as one of our candidates receives the Sacrament of Confirmation. Through this sacrament, the baptized are sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit, completing the grace of Baptism and being equipped with spiritual strength to live as disciples of Christ.

As we witness this sacred moment, may we be reminded of our own Confirmation and renewed in our openness to the Holy Spirit. Just as the apostles were changed at Pentecost, we too are called to be transformed—to live our faith with courage, joy, and purpose. Come, Holy Spirit, renew the face of the earth—and our hearts!

In the Old Testament, Pentecost was the feast of the celebration of the giving of the Law to Moses on the fiftieth day after the Israelites' departure from Egypt (Passover) (Ex. 19-20). In the new dispensation, Pentecost is the celebration of the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples of Jesus on the fiftieth day after the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead. Ten days after the Ascension, when the one hundred and twenty disciples were gathered in the Upper Room, the Holy Spirit descended upon them.

According to the law of Israel, hundred and twenty was the number for an official liturgical gathering. Thus, the one hundred and twenty disciples gathered in the Upper Room were the ideal worshipping community.

Among the Jews, Pentecost was also called the 'Day of the First Fruits' (Num 28:26). As the name indicates, it was the celebration of the 'First Fruits'. It was celebrated when the first fruits of the harvest began to come in, which was around the first of June. It opened the harvest season. By the providence of God, on the day of Pentecost, the Church, the first fruit, was born. Thus, Pentecost marks the beginning of the new church of God.

The Holy Spirit came upon the disciples because of Jesus' prayer, and He was not sent for a short time, but to abide with us forever. The power of the Holy Spirit is present even today. As He infused courage and confidence among the frightened disciples of Jesus and transformed them from being a band of frightened men into fearless preachers of the Gospel, so the Spirit is there, even today, among us to resuscitate and empower us.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, as we celebrate the feast of the Pentecost, let us pray that the Lord may once again fill us with the Holy Spirit so that our hearts, which may be dead like the dry bones, maybe set ablaze with the love of Christ, and may we proclaim the Good News of Christ until nation after nation may yield to the sway of Christ. Amen.

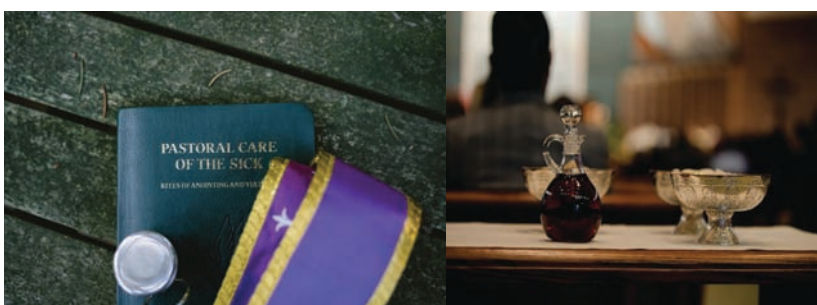

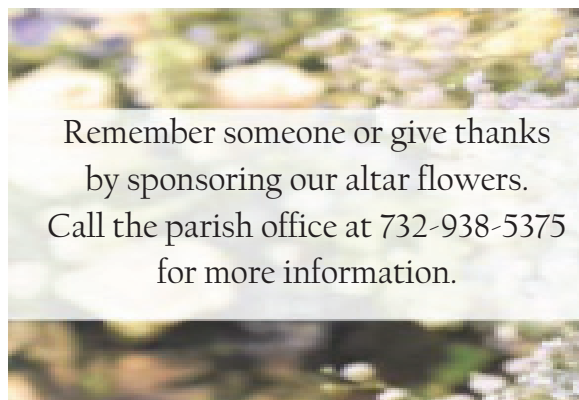

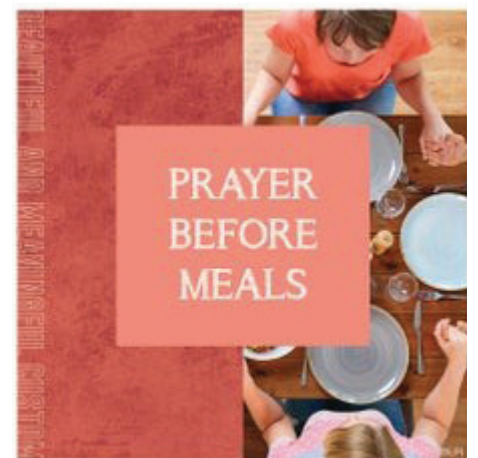
“Whoever loves me will keep my word,” Jesus tells his disciples, “and my Father...will come to him and make our dwelling with him.” We know what’s at stake. We know what we have to do. So when the Father comes, will He make His dwelling with us?

## Prayer Before Meals, Explained

Anyone who has ever dined in a Catholic home has probably heard the prayer before meals that begins with the famous words: “Bless us, O Lord, and these thy gifts.” These words in particular are first found in the Galesian Sacramentary, a book of Christian liturgy that dates to the seventh or eighth century, but the practice of praying before meals is Biblical, harkening back to the Jewish ritual washing of hands before eating. In the Gospels, Jesus is shown praying before the Last Supper and other meals, setting an example followed by Paul in Acts 27:35.

In his 2015 encyclical *Laudato SI'*, Pope Francis urged the faithful “to return to this beautiful and meaningful custom.”

“That moment of blessing,” he wrote, “reminds us of our dependence on God for life; it strengthens our feeling of gratitude for the gifts of creation...(and) reaffirms our solidarity with those in greatest need.”

## Godparent For the Sacrament of Baptism | Sponsor for the Sacrament of Confirmation

### To Serve as a Godparent

To serve as a godparent is more than an honor—it is a sacred calling. A godparent supports the faith journey of a child by example, prayer, and ongoing spiritual encouragement. Chosen not just for closeness, but for character and commitment to the Catholic faith, a godparent walks alongside the child and their family, helping to nurture a life rooted in Christ.

### To Serve as a Confirmation Sponsor

To serve as a Confirmation sponsor is a meaningful role in the life of a young Catholic. A sponsor stands as a witness to the faith, guiding the candidate through prayer, encouragement, and example. Chosen for their active Catholic life, sponsors help the candidate grow in their relationship with Christ and take their place as a fully initiated member of the Church. It is a commitment of presence, prayer, and ongoing spiritual support.

### Eligibility

*According to Canon Law, godparents & sponsors must:*

Be a practicing Catholic in good standing with the Church

Be at least 16 yrs of age

Received the sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation

Not be bound by canonical penalties

Not be the father or mother of the one being baptized

### Letter of Good Standing

*Before we can issue "a letter of good standing" from the Office of the Pastor, we ask that you be an **active, registered parishioner** for a **minimum of six (6) months**. An active member:*

Attends Mass on a regular basis & is registered, showing regular participation with the life, mission and support of St. Catherine of Siena Parish.

*Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago **but now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of this parish.***

*Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides.*

***This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.***

The 7 Gifts of the Holy Spirit were promised by Christ and are made known to us by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and Confirmation.

**Jesus died on the cross out of love for us. This same love gives us the Gifts of the Spirit to help us on our journey as disciples of Christ.**

Follow these directions to turn the cross into a gift box.  
Color then cut on dotted lines - fold on light, solid lines into gift box, tape edges together, then the remaining edges.



Color the bow red; RED is the color of Pentecost, the vestments of the priest and the color people wear to signify the LOVE and FIRE of the SPIRIT.

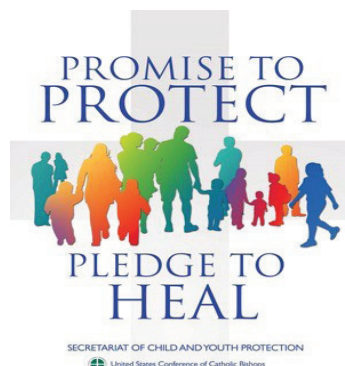
