Sixth Sunday of Easter

The Nature of Peace

The peace, which Christ gives, is not the peace, which the world gives. When Christ says 'peace', He gives peace, but when people say 'peace' they only wish peace. Man can only erect banners of goodwill and peace, but Christ could impart that peace. Christ's word conveys peace to us. What the world only wishes, Christ has the power to give.

The peace which the world gives is only transitory. What the world gives will last only for a short time, but the peace Jesus gives, like all His blessings, is eternal. Nothing can take away that peace – neither sickness, nor hunger, not poverty, not plenty, nor life, nor death.

The peace the world gives is very shallow. It is a thin cover over the vast sea of restlessness. It is at most an excitement, but real, lasting peace is given by Christ and Christ only.

Possessing Christ and His peace, does not necessarily preclude us from experiencing the tumults and conflicts in our lives. There are many things in the world which will disturb us to the very end, and many things from within us will surge and threaten to ruffle our peace. We must constantly fight against such things and make efforts not to lose Christ's given peace. In everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let our requests be made known to God, so that nothing may break the calm we have. Possessing Christ will enable us to calm the storms, which lash against us. May the peace, which Christ promised His disciples, reside in our hearts and in our families.

May Christ's love and command reign supreme in all the aspects of our lives, so that we may enjoy His peace. Amen.



Inspiration of the Week

God makes His dwelling with those who love Him and keep His word. We must all make our lives places where God feels welcome to dwell. Our actions, our words, our decisions must all say in one voice: "Come, Holy Spirit!"

Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Explained

Our Lady of Perpetual Help refers both to a title conferred upon the Blessed Mother as well as to a corresponding icon that dates to the late Middle Ages. Painted on wood, the original icon has a Byzantine style and depicts the Blessed Mother holding the Christ Child. She is flanked by St. Michael and St. Gabriel, who hold the instruments of Christ's passion, including a spear, nails and the Crown of Thorns. In the image, Christ seemingly leans into his mother's embrace for comfort and strength as he contemplates these objects.



The icon is thought to have originated in Crete, but for 300 years was venerated in the Church of San Matteo in Merulana in Rome. Blessed Pope Pius IX entrusted the image to the Order of Redemptorists, who moved it to the Church of St. Alphonsus. He later established the Feast of Our Lady of Perpetual Help on June 27.

The Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord Jesus will be celebrated in all the Latin-rite dioceses of New Jersey, Sunday, June 1, 2025.

Godparent For the Sacrament of Baptism | Sponsor for the Sacrament of Confirmation

To Serve as a Godparent

To serve as a godparent is more than an honor—it is a sacred calling. A godparent supports the faith journey of a child by example, prayer, and ongoing spiritual encouragement. Chosen not just for closeness, but for character and commitment to the Catholic faith, a godparent walks alongside the child and their family, helping to nurture a life rooted in Christ.

To Serve as a Confirmation Sponsor

To serve as a Confirmation sponsor is a meaningful role in the life of a young Catholic. A sponsor stands as a witness to the faith, guiding the candidate through prayer, encouragement, and example. Chosen for their active Catholic life, sponsors help the candidate grow in their relationship with Christ and take their place as a fully initiated member of the Church. It is a commitment of presence, prayer, and ongoing spiritual support.

Eligibility

According to Canon Law, godparents & sponsors must:

Be a practicing Catholic in good standing with the Church

Be at least 16 yrs of age

Received the sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation

Not be bound by canonical penalties

Not be the father or mother of the one being baptized

Letter of Good Standing

Before we can issue "a letter of good standing" from the Office of the Pastor, we ask that you be an active, registered parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months. An active member:

Attends Mass on a regular basis & is registered, showing regular participation with the life, mission and support of St. Catherine of Siena Parish.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago *but now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of this parish.*

Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides.

This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.


